Criminal Records Bureau Disclosure Process

Identification Check

The individual (applicant) subject to the check **will be required** to produce the following: -

- At **least one** item of photographic evidence (e.g. a current passport, or a new style U.K driving licence)
In the absence of photographic evidence, a full birth certificate. A certificate issued at the time of birth will carry more weight than one issued more recently.
- At least one item of address related evidence (e.g. utility bill, bank, credit card or mortgage statement containing the name and address of the applicant)

Disclosure Application Form

The applicant needs to contact the Criminal Records Bureau on 0870 90 90 844 to apply for an **Enhanced** Disclosure Application Form and commence the criminal record check process. As part of the on-line checks applicant will be expected to quote full name, address lived at during the last 5 years, date and place of birth, N.I number, driving licence and passport details. Will also be asked to confirm the Organisation name - **Carmarthenshire County Councils**, registration number (reference number **209 591 0000 3**)
